From the Pastor's Desk:

Greetings, beloved church,

As the month of June unfolds before us, I am reminded of the powerful message of going beyond our comfort that Jesus demonstrated in the Gospel of Luke. In Luke 5:4, we read about the moment when Jesus called upon Simon (Peter) to "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Simon, astounded by the miraculous catch of fish that followed, if we are willing to go into the deep.

This passage beautifully illustrates the transformative power of radical hospitality – the kind of hospitality that goes beyond mere politeness or routine gestures of welcome. Radical hospitality is about opening our hearts, minds, and doors to the unexpected, embracing opportunities for connection with others, even when it feels uncomfortable or challenging. It is about being willing to step out of our comfort zones, into the deep waters of faith and compassion, trusting that God's grace will guide us.

Just as Jesus called Simon to cast his nets into the deep waters, we too are called to venture beyond the familiar shores of our lives and reach out to those who may seem different or distant from us. Radical hospitality requires us to set aside our preconceived notions and fears, and instead, extend a hand of friendship and understanding to all whom we encounter.




